INMANTEC Institutions, Ghaziabad, successfully organized a National Debate Competition on the thought-provoking topic, “One Nation One Election is Good for India,” held over two days — 11th and 12th July 2025. The competition was conceptualized to promote awareness, critical thinking, and intellectual engagement among the students and to encourage a deeper understanding of key national reforms.

The event was inaugurated by the Executive Director, Dr. Pankaj A. Gupta, and the Director – Academics, Dr. Latika Gupta. In their opening remarks, they highlighted the importance of debate during the journey as a student and stressed the relevance of the topic in India’s evolving democratic and political landscape. They also encouraged students to cultivate analytical and communication skills through such academic platforms.

The competition witnessed active participation from students across various universities and colleges in India. A total of over 50 participants registered, and 30 finalists were selected for the final online rounds. The event was conducted online via video conferencing platforms to allow pan-India participation. The debate was conducted in two rounds: Preliminary and Final. Participants could speak either for or against the motion. A panel of expert judges evaluated participants based on content, clarity, argument strength, rebuttals, and presentation skills.

Participants demonstrated in-depth research and exceptional oratory skills. Several legal, administrative, constitutional, and economic aspects were debated.
